It's the New Year 2009 and we have old business to finish and new business to begin.

Lion Tom Brown and I have been arranging the distribution of the \$10,000.00 emergency grant from LCIF for the victims of the fires in Orange County. We have given \$5,000.00 to the city of Anaheim for distribution in that area, and \$5,000.00 to Operation OC, a relief organization based in Tustin, which was

the hub of the emergency relief which came into operation immediately following the fires in October. Both amounts of money will be shared out amongst those in need in the form of Target gift certificates, and I hope to be able to make a more detailed report at the Cabinet Meeting on January 24. At that meeting there will be more information from our featured speaker about Operation OC, and the Orange County Rescue Mission.

By the time you read this, the Rose Parade festivities will be over, and I want to give a big thank you to all the Lions in 4L-4 who have contributed to the success of this project in so many ways - Lion Jack Tanaka for taking charge of our district decorating day, Lions John Doogan and Ken Bell for making the Leo decorating day such a success, IPDG John Casteel and Lion Sheila Casteel for traveling all over California to make other districts more aware of the project and helping to raise funds, VDG Judy who sold such a lot of float pins, and to all the Lions who went to decorate the float. Our float was so beautiful and such an excellent representation of the work we do as Lions and the wonderful Helen Keller who challenged us, so long ago, to become "Knights of the Blind".

So now we look forward to the next six months. I hope all the clubs made resolutions to get more members, to not drop members and to encourage those wayward Lions to come back and resume their great work for our communities. Remember, I said I wanted to continue the "Plus" numbers from last year to show the rest of California that 4L-4 is always the Mighty Mouse District, not just the Mickey Mouse district.

I shall continue to travel around the district to club meetings and fund raisers and celebrations, and I look forward to seeing all of you again.

Because it is our District fund, we do not have the same constrictions put on the money, as was the case with the emergency grant from LICF. Many, many thanks for your thoughtfulness and generosity towards those in need. We really are Everyday Heroes in our District.



Fire Disaster 2009

Last spring I received several phone calls from our district governor, Elizabeth Warren, asking me to stay involved in the district. She finally talked me into accepting the Disaster Preparedness Chair. At the time I thought to myself, "Since we had had so many disastrous fires last year, there would not be more this year, after all, hadn't we used up our quota of disasters?" Need I say more?

On that fateful Saturday, November, 15, when I saw smoke to the east, I called the Gov. We must have talked to each other 20 times by Sunday night. I.D. Dana Biggs was already on top of getting the grant from LCIF for us. Sunday, Zone B chair Mike Smith and I visited an evacuation center in Anaheim but we were turned away. Basically, we were told "No thanks, we don't need your help". I spoke to many Lions in our district that lived or worked in the burn areas and I was glad to hear that ALL were safe.

Monday morning we had our grant application from LCIF. I made calls to FEMA, and to the cities that were affected by the fires. Some of the people I talked to simply wanted us to give our money to the very same organization that had originally turned away our assistance. Eventually we were put in contact with two groups that we felt comfortable working with: Operation O.C., and the Anaheim Community foundation. Both of these groups work directly with fire victims.

Governor Elizabeth, V.D.G. Judy Schnitzer, P.D.G.s Barbara Hayward and Mike Schaefer, Ron Hayward and I met with Operation O.C. and received a tour of their operation. What an organization! We presented them with \$5,000 in Target gift cards to be distributed directly to the fire victims. Later I met with Anaheim Mayor Curt Pringle and Colleen Smagala, Vice President of the Anaheim Community Foundation. I presented them with an additional \$6,100.00 in Target Gift Cards. We have been asked to meet with the Anaheim City Council to be recognized for our great work helping fire victims.

I would like to say a GREAT BIG Thank You to all those that stepped up and donated their money to help the fire victims in our district: LCIF \$10,000.00, Anaheim Lions \$1,100.00, OCKALC Foundation \$1,000.00, HB Host \$500.00, D.G. Elizabeth \$300.00, Pomona Breakfast \$250.00, Rancho Cucamonga Community \$200.00, Upland Host \$200.00, Fullerton Host \$200.00 and Ontario Upland \$100.00. The balance of these monies will be distributed at a later date.

Hearing & Speech Action News

How are you doing with your New Year's Resolutions? Got room for one more? This should be easy - just keep reading and when you finish look for someone who needs this information and pass it on. Most of us know about "Captioning", the words that appear on TV and movie screens that are set up to assist in understanding the words that accompany the pictures. And maybe you have seen the CapTel phones with a small screen on the phone that displays the caller's words. Now along comes CapTel's next generation.

WebCapTel connects any phone - your desk phone, cordless phone or cell phone - to your desktop or laptop computer and the Internet. This system displays captions of everything heard on the phone displays it through your internet browser. Each step in placing or receiving a call is shown on the screen. Your conversation can be saved or printed just like email and you have your computer's abilities to select the type font, size and color your prefer.

Many of these advantages are available with a simpler system called CapTelUSB that connects a special phone to your computer but not the internet. For details call 888-269-7477 (Voice or 800-482-2424 (TTY) or see www.captionedtelephone.com. Then tell a friend!




Your Fellow Lion

I was born in the San Fernando Valley where I grew up and attended Beachy Street School, Terra Bella Street School (Now the northbound lanes of Interstate 5), Pacoima Jr. High School, and Sutter Jr. High School and Canoga Park high School.

At 18 years of age I joined the U.S. Navy and after boot camp was sent to Midway Island where I became a member of the Island's Military Police Division. After a year I was transferred to Air development Squadron 4 stationed at Point Magu Naval Air Station in California. I worked in the Aviation Fire Control Dept which maintained the attack radar in F4 Phantom and F8 Crusader fighter aircraft. I was honorably discharged in September 1968.

I immediately went to work at General Motors Parts Division in Van Nuys, California. Shortly after starting work the warehouse was moved to Santa Fe Springs in Southern L.A. County. In 1970 the United Auto Workers struck GM so I found a job at Pacific Stereo in North Hollywood to keep money coming in during the strike. When they settled the strike I decided to stay with Pacific Stereo. In 1984 with Pacific Stereo near bankruptcy I was laid off. After six months of looking I found a job with TG&Y Stores at the Distribution center which happened to be across the street from the GM warehouse. I had come full circle (sort of). After a year, TG&Y Stores was sold to McCory Stores



(another 5 & dime chain) which had a distribution center nearby which meant we were all laid off. After another six months I found a job with Intecom Inc. (A telephone switch company) running their distribution center in Marina Del Rey, California. A year and a half later I could see that Intecom was probably going into bankruptcy so I found a job with Sun Valley Waterbed as their Western Regional Facilities Manager, I was to handle everything except sales. Two weeks after joining them I could tell something was wrong and finally got one of the people in their human resources dept. In Phoenix to admit that the company was probably weeks away from shutting down.

The following Sunday I saw an ad in the L.A. Times classified section under warehouse managers for someone to run a prop dept. at one of the studios. I went through the interview process and was hired. So, one month after joining Sun Valley Waterbed I quit. They actually lasted about six months before going out of business. I have been working in the entertainment industry for twenty-one years.

As for my personal life, I have been married to Lion Jacqui Howes for nineteen years. I have a forty year old son who works for a biotech company in San Francisco, a thirty two year old daughter who is a makeup artist at a salon in Toluca Lake, California (she is expecting a boy in March), a thirty nine year old stepson who teaches English at a high school in Southern Orange County, and a thirty-five year old stepson who works at a Doctor test center in Houston, Texas. He and his wife had my first grandson, Max in 2007.

In 1994 Jacqui & I moved to Seal Beach. We started spending time at Kinda Lahania restaurant on Main Street. We noticed on certain Wednesday nights there was some sort of meeting going on in the back of the restaurant. I asked the bartender (Lion Rich Dudash) whom we had gotten to know, what was going on. He told me to show up at the next meeting and that was that. I've been president a couple of times, secretary more time that was good for me, ran the Fish Fry twice and the car drawing three times.

Finally, I live and die with the Cleveland Brown (mostly die). My grandson Max's mind is being poisoned with the Houston Texans and my daughter's husband is a Packers fan which means it will take a great effort on my part to convince my two grandsons of the greatness of the Cleveland Brown. 
